

# MESSAGE FROM CILTM PRESIDENT PROFESSOR TS DR MUHAMMAD ZALY SHAH FCILT



Colleagues, I want to discuss something critical to our mission: the importance of humanitarian logistics. We've all seen the impact of natural disasters and crises, and while first responders and medical teams often get the spotlight, it's the logistics that enable them to carry out their lifesaving work efficiently. This isn't just about survival; it's about helping people maintain their humanity even in the hardest times.

## SAFER ROAD INFRASTRUCTURE FOR RIDERS AND PROMOTING RIDING ON THE LEFT LANE

There were 6443 deaths on our roads in 2023. Seventy percent (70%) or 4540 of those who died in road crashes in 2023 were motorcyclists or pillion riders comprising 32% deaths on Federal roads, 34% deaths on State roads, and 19% deaths on Local Council roads.

In the ASEAN region, Malaysia has the third highest death toll for rider deaths in ASEAN behind Thailand (highest) and Vietnam (2nd highest). Malaysia needs priority interventions to reduce high rider deaths. If nothing serious is done 45,000 riders will die in the next 10 years and 150,000 will get seriously injured. A third of the seriously injured will have life long disabilities needing medical and welfare support.

The most effective intervention to reduce motorcycle road crashes is via building of Exclusive motorcycle lanes or 2.5 metre wide paved shoulders. Exclusive motorcycle lanes have the potential to reduce rider death toll by 80%. A cheaper option is to build paved shoulders for motorcyclists which can reduce rider deaths by 30% to 40%.

At a road safety workshop organised by Ministry of Transport on the 18th and 19th September at Marriot Putrajaya, one of the key recommendations is to implement JKR research findings and Motorcycle Safety Policy recommendations - NTJ 33/2015 entitled Guidelines for Motorcycle Facilities. It was agreed that the minimum infra provision for rider safety along existing federal, state and local council roads should be 2.5-metre-wide paved shoulders to be separated from other traffic lanes by road markings. Exclusive motorcycle lanes can be considered for enhanced rider safety at selected locations where traffic volume is high. To reduce costs

existing road reserves on Federal, State and Local Council roads should be utilised for the construction of these lanes. Also, a cheaper approach to construct the proposed paved shoulders is for JKR to construct these lanes themselves instead of privatisation which will lead to higher construction costs.

Implementation approach recommended is for State governments to utilise a portion of the annual Marris federal road grant to build paved shoulders on existing State roads. Local authorities have to play their part to implement this paved road shoulders initiative on roads under Local Council jurisdiction. Federal Roads are under the jurisdiction of Kementerian Kerja Raya (KKR). KKR should play their part to build 2.5 metre road shoulders for motorcycle riders on Federal roads.

## EFFECTIVENESS OF ROAD INFRASTRUCTURE FOR MOTORCYCLE



Exclusive lane (EML)

Exclusive Motorcycle lanes (EML) are forgiving roads infrastructure with physical barrier and have potential to reduce fatal crashes by **80%\***.



Non-exclusive lane (NEMCL)

Non-Exclusive Motorcycle lanes (EML) are separated with non-physical barrier and have potential to reduce fatal crashes by **60%\*\***.



Paved shoulder

Paved shoulder provides a refuge path for motorcyclists to stay away from other vehicles and have potential to reduce fatal crashes by

**30%-40%\*\*\***.

\* Radin Umar et al. shows that with the introduction of a 30 km (in each direction) EML has reduced motorcycle crashes by 39% in the first year of implementation. Subsequent study by MIROS indicates that EML can reduce crash risk by as much as 80%.  
\*\* A study by MIROS in 2012 indicated that NEMCL can reduce fatal and serious crashes among motorcyclist by up to 60%.

## Riding On the Left Lane Saves Rider Lives

A safety policy of limiting motorcyclists to the left lane has the potential to save rider lives in the immediate and short term while waiting for safer road infra for our riders on federal, state and local council roads. The Ministry of Transport has approved advocacy for riding on the left lane for all Federal, State and Local Council roads. Benefits of a ride left policy include: -

- Better frontal and side view of the road ahead and the roadside environment to identify road hazards.
- Speed reduction from 120kmph (fast lane speed) to 70kmph (slow lane speed) which is the average operating speed of the left lane.
- No more lane splitting and lane filtering.
- Drastic reduction of riding in the blind spot zone.
- More orderly vehicular traffic movement on fast lanes.
- Easier for riders to spot breakdown and parked vehicles in on the road ahead enabling them to slow down to prevent road crash.

To facilitate this behaviour change among our riders the Road Traffic Rules 1959 should be amended to give priority to motorcyclists in the left lane. The effect of giving riders priority in the left lane is to ensure bigger vehicles give due regard to the safety of motorcycles riders in the left lane.

## Advocacy of Ride Left Policy

The proposed ride left safety campaign should emphasize the following: -

- Dangers of riding in the fast lane. (Average lane speed for the fast lane is 120kmph) (MIROS 2019)
- Hazards of lane filtering. Lane filtering means riding between 2 lanes of traffic.
- Hazards of lane splitting. Lane splitting means riding zig zag between 2 or more traffic lanes with different lane speeds. Lane splitting also involves riding in third party vehicular blind spots and rider blind spots.

**Riders can further enhance their safety in the left lane by the following safety guidelines:**

- **Wearing safety vests with luminous stripes especially for night riding, gloves, riding goggles etc.**
- **Maintaining a safe following distance of 2 seconds in good weather and 4 seconds in rainy weather.**
- **Waiting at R&R or rain shelters during heavy thunderstorms and lightning. (Road authorities need to build more rain shelters with good accessibility for riders. Current designs of rain shelters should be improved to provide food, drinks and other amenities for enhanced rider comfort)**

**The Ministry of Transport, Bahagian Keselamatan Jalan Raya (BKJR), JPJ, Jabatan Siasatan dan Penguatkuasaan Trafik (JSPT) and Majlis Keselamatan Jalan Raya (MKJR) need to lead the proposal for a “National Ride Left Safety Campaign for Motorcycle Riders”. Riding on the left has great potential to save lives of our motorcycle riders as it will lower rider speed and stop the risky behaviour of lane splitting and lane filtering.**

## Benchmark Visit in Thailand: Developing the Occupational Framework with KESUMA


### PAHANG SECTION




Politeknik Ibrahim Sultan secured 1st place, KV Pasir Gudang was the runner-up, and KPM Bandar Penawar took 3rd place.




## WILAT MALAYSIA INSPIRE KITCHEN: MALAM PUISI MENGUKIR BANGSA


