I would therefore like to humbly urge all our members to grab this opportunity to contribute positively in your own way to the betterment of our industry.



"Malaysia's Logistics Industry Soars Up 15 Spots on Global LPI Rankings"

Malaysia's logistics industry is making significant progress, as evident from the recently released 2023 World Bank Logistics Performance Index (LPI). The country has secured the second-best performing ASEAN country position, making an impressive 15-spot jump to No.26, up from No.41 in 2018 and No.32 in 2016. This is a significant achievement, and Malaysia's best performance was ranked No.25 in 2014.

The LPI is an essential benchmarking tool that assesses countries' trade logistics performance. Based on a worldwide survey of international logistics operators, the LPI helps identify the challenges and opportunities countries face and what they can do to improve their logistics performance. Several data partners, including maritime shipping and container tracking, postal and air freight activities, collect and make available the LPI's information.

Although Malaysia has an outstanding infrastructure for logistics, the country still faces various challenges that impact its logistics performance. For example, there is a regulatory mismatch between different government agencies and departments, leading to confusion and delays in customs clearance procedures.

Additionally, the country's borders often experience bottlenecks due to a lack of harmonization in procedures, causing further delays and increased costs for logistics operators.



Despite these challenges, Malaysia's logistics industry has strengths that it can capitalize on. The country has excellent connectivity via land, sea, and air, enabling efficient transport and delivery of goods. Additionally, Malaysia has a vast network of ports and airports, making it an attractive logistics hub for the region. Moreover, Malaysia's logistics industry has tremendous potential for growth and innovation. The country has a vibrant e-commerce sector, which is fueling demand for more efficient logistics services.

Malaysia can further develop its value chain activities, focusing on high-value-added services to increase revenue and competitiveness. The country can also invest in developing the necessary skills for its logistics workforce to improve productivity and efficiency. This 26th ranking will have a direct impact on FDI as well. Malaysia's logistics industry has made remarkable progress, securing the second-best performing ASEAN country position in the 2023 World Bank Logistics Performance Index. While the country faces various challenges that impact its logistics performance, Malaysia's strengths, including its robust infrastructure and excellent connectivity via land, sea, and air, provide opportunities for growth and innovation. CILTM is confident, Malaysia can further improve its logistics performance by addressing its regulatory framework, customs procedures, and value chain activities, investing in developing the necessary skills for its logistics workforce, and becoming the preferred logistics destination in the ASEAN region. We will now target to be in the top 10 position.





IBF International and WiLAT Global Capacity Building Centre-WCBC: Humanitarian Logistics Webinar

addressed The webinar the logistical response, challenges faced in disaster particularly in areas where the physical infrastructure weak. The speakers is emphasized the importance of coordination among the assisting organizations and clear international. roles defined among the national, provincial, and local regional. organizations. They also highlighted the need for logistics expertise in areas concerning transport to ensure efficient evacuation and return of people affected, and efficient management of goods that come in as aid.. Esra Kivrak CMILT, the WiLAT Turkiye Chairperson, gave an overview of the current situation in Turkiye post-earthquake and the logistical challenges faced, particularly in reaching areas where the road infrastructure has been severely damaged



She highlighted the initiatives that CILT Turkiye has already taken in providing essential goods and is looking forward to CILT's teamwork in establishing a Disaster Response Team comprising experts who have experience in managing humanitarian logistics, who can develop a tool kit and initiate a response whenever a disaster occurs.



Dr. John Blunt, FCILT from Australia, who has experience extensive in post-disaster recovery environments, spoke next. began by identifying that a natural disaster becomes a humanitarian crisis whenever it where occurs in areas the physical infrastructure is weak. He explained that a geographical setting with transport infrastructure takes more time for reconstruction, which would probably take six months or more. He also emphasized that during such disasters, assisting organizations only focus on their specialization. important measure to be taken is in the coordination of services rendered by the assisting organizations. Using his experience and cases, he indicated that it is essential that clear roles have to be defined among the international, regional, national, provincial, and local assisting organizations.

Fiona Knight FCILT, the IVP Australasia, shared the lessons learned from the recent cyclone disasters in New Zealand and reflected on Dr. John Blunt's sharing.

She provided a summary of the disaster caused by Cyclone Hale in January 2023 and again in February Cyclone Gabrielle, where roads were destroyed, cutting off communities, and supplies could only be delivered by air. She spoke about the challenges faced, such as accommodation shortages and poor infrastructure. She then shared some actions that can be taken by a nation, an organization, and an individual in



Finbarr Cleary FCILT, Chairman of the CILT International Business Forum (IBF), gave a brief speech on the background of this initiative, where Berna Akvildiz FCILT had after requested assistance soon the earthquake occurred. A group was formed between IBF and Wilat, where Karyn Welsh, FCILT from CILT Australia, set up a disaster relief fund, and soon after this webinar was planned to launch the fund and gauge the disaster interest to form a response committee moving ahead.

She emphasized the importance of disaster response and the need for collaboration among logistics professionals to build a more effective disaster response system.

The webinar highlighted the significance of humanitarian logistics and the role of logistics professionals in disaster response. speakers discussed the importance areas logistics expertise in such as transportation, infrastructure. waste management, and evacuation of people affected by natural disasters. They also emphasized the importance of collaboration among organizations at all levels, from the international to the local level, in disaster response.
